CLASS TITLE: Lineman First Class

ACCOUNTABLE TO:

Transmission and Distribution Department Supervisor

PRIMARY OBJECTIVE OF POSITION:

Under general supervision, performs skilled work of journeyman level in construction, maintenance, and repair of electrical distribution and transmission lines and systems, both overhead and underground; occasionally leads other personnel.

MAJOR AREAS OF ACCOUNTABILITY AND PERFORMANCE:

Performs and participates in construction, installation, maintenance, and repair of overhead and underground electrical distribution and transmission lines; sets poles, strings wire, and hangs or installs transformers, lightning arrestors, cutouts, cross arms, and insulators, installs and connects meter reading equipment, switches, and related components; periodically serves on call in emergencies; participates in survey work as necessary to establish pole locations; drives and operates a line truck with various types of equipment attachments, such as hydraulic derrick and pole hole auger; works with underground construction and maintenance crews in pulling wires, setting transformers, building and maintaining substations and related activities; installs and repairs residential and commercial service lines and facilities; handles and inspects for PCBs; replaces burned out street lights, starters, and photo electric cells; trims trees; attends safety meetings and follows safe practices; corrects power failures; inspects vehicles and equipment and performs minor maintenance; keeps work and line records; responds to after hours calls for service as assigned; may train others and supervises other linemen in the absence of a lead lineman. Cleans yard and building; performs other duties as assigned.

EXAMPLES OF PERFORMANCE CRITERIA AND QUALIFICATIONS:

Considerable knowledge of approved methods, materials, and tools used in high voltage electric distribution and transmission line construction and maintenance work, including substations and electrical gear. Considerable knowledge of the principles of electric theory as applied to electric distribution and transmission systems and of the occupational hazards of power line work and of applicable safety precautions and devices. Knowledge of first aid, including CPR. Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions. Ability to climb poles and work with high voltage wires, exercising proper safety precautions. Skill in the use of line tools and testing equipment. Possesses hand/eye/foot coordination adequate to operate aerial and digger trucks, power tools and a vehicle, and to climb poles and ladders. Ability to talk and hear in person and by telephone, two-way-radio and videos; ability to see and read instructions, name plates on components, manuals and work orders. Good physical condition and health; sufficient physical strength and agility to perform heavy manual and climbing tasks under adverse weather conditions.

SUPERVISION – RESPONSIBILITY FOR WORK OF OTHERS:

May lead other linemen on specific projects.

EDUCATION, TRAINING, AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS:

Any combination of experience and training equivalent to graduation from high school supplemented by vocational apprentice lineman training, and a minimum of two years as a Lineman Second Class. Possession of a valid Colorado Commercial Driver's License; certified as a First Class Lineman; possession of a current Red Cross Safety Card.

PHYSICAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS:

Work often performed in inclement weather conditions and temperature extremes. Must have ability to perform moderate/heavy physical work and to lift and carry 50 pounds regularly and occasionally over 100 pounds. Must have ability to stand, climb, twist, reach, kneel, grasp, reach, ride, pick, pinch, walk, sit, bend, crawl, push, pull and perform a variety of similar body movements.
